

## A little Footbridge history

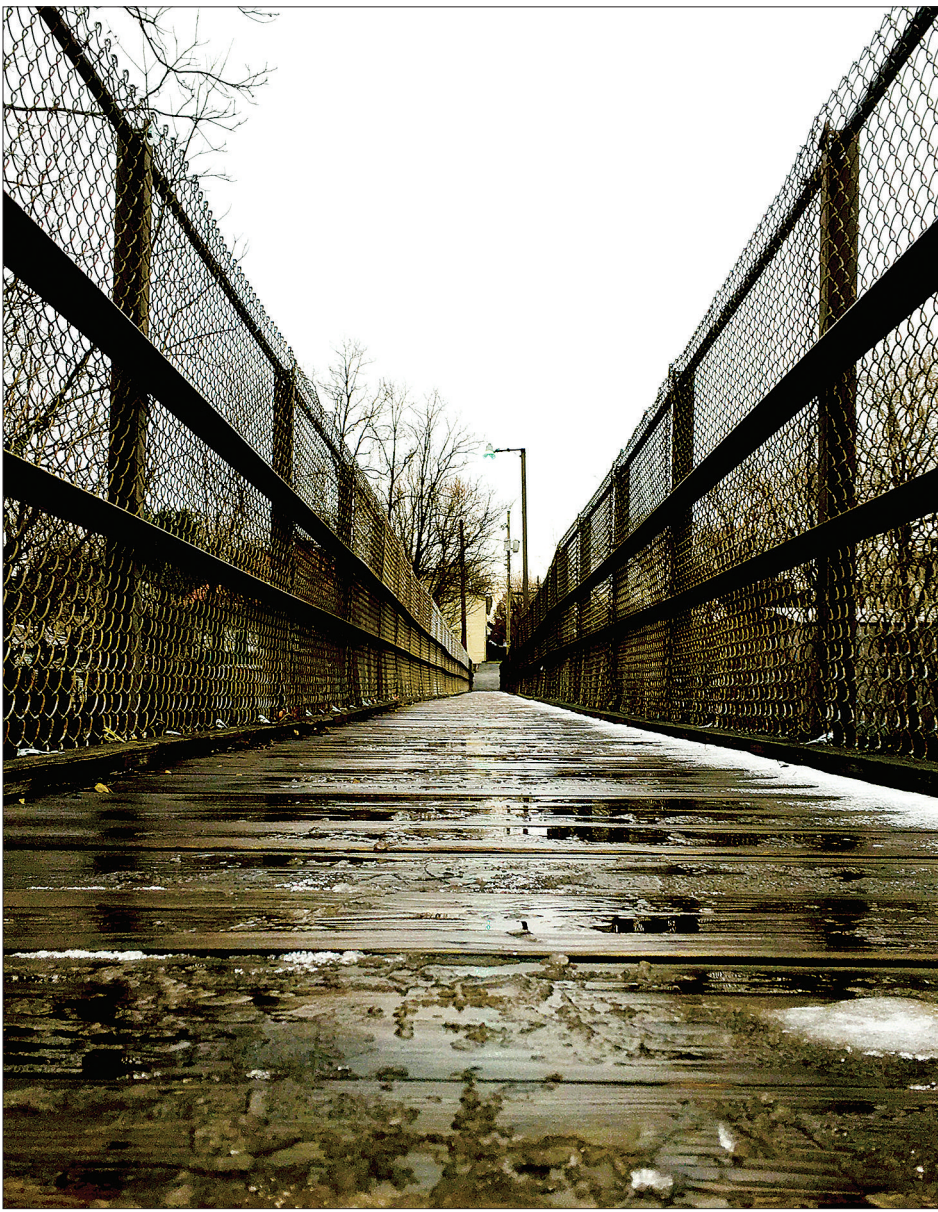

Rain and a scattering of snow was evident on the Greensburg Footbridge Saturday morning. Built in the late 1920s at a cost of \$4,500, the bridge is 445 feet long, 40 feet high at its highest point, with a five feet wide plank walkway. The bridge was built to connect the public square with the L&N Railroad Depot. Prior to the bridge, train passengers faced a challenging trek to the square as described in a March 3, 1880 article from the Lebanon Weekly Standard, "The depot is separated from the business part of town by a deep ravine. We had very wholesome exercise climbing up the opposite slope." The article told of the first train ride from Lebanon to Greensburg. The train ran six days a week, leaving Lebanon at 3:05 p.m. and arriving in Greensburg at 5:50 p.m. At 6:30 a.m. the next morning the train left Greensburg to arrive in Lebanon at 9:40 a.m.

## Jan. Grand Jury indicts four

The Green County Grand Jury indicted four people at its monthly session Jan. 5. Kimberly Curry, 38, 7627 Hwy. 88, was indicted on one count each of trafficking in methamphetamine, possession of drug paraphernalia, possession of unspecified second- and third-degree controlled substances, trafficking in less than 8 ounces of marijuana and illegal possession of a legend drug. The charges stem

from an alleged incident Oct. 27-28. Bond was set at \$18,000. Karissa Smallwood, 26, 70 Hwy. 1464, was indicted on one count each of possession of methamphetamine, possession of drug paraphernalia, possession of an unspecified second-degree controlled substance, no license in possession, careless driving, failure to produce insurance card and improper turning. The charges stem from an alleged incident Oct. 27. Bond was set at \$15,000.

Kaitlyn S. Cisco, 27, 102 Peterson St., Campbellsville, was indicted on one count of second-degree possession of a forged instrument. The charge stems from an alleged incident March 25. Bond was set at \$1,500. Larry Hall, 68, 36 Cotton Chaudoin Road, was indicted on one count each of fourth-degree assault, third or more offense in five years and persistent felony offender. The charges stem from an alleged incident Dec. 2. Bond was set at \$15,000.

Officers of GPD conducted 119 criminal investigations. The average response time, from the time the officer is given the call until the officer arrives, was less than 2 minutes in 2018.

GPD officers were required to attend approximately 118 hours in Court and received

over 280 hours of training in 2018, including both classroom and online.

2018 data shows a decrease in domestic violence calls as compared to 2017. GPD saw a rise in complaint calls by approximately 100 calls. Accidents declined in 2018 as compared to 2017.

Criminal arrest increased by 124 in 2018 as compared to 2017.

The Greensburg/Green County E-911 Center dispatched over 9500 calls in 2018, with 63% Law Enforcement, 26% EMS, 5% Fire, and the remainder being; Rescue, Transportation, and Coroner.
