

Dragons lose close game in Class All 'A' Region

The Dragons experienced a week of highs and lows. They entered the first round of the Fifth Region All 'A' Classic at home prepared. Campbellsville Eagles were their opponent. This was the second game of the season between the two schools. In the first game, played December 17, the Eagles defeated the Dragons, 79-53. This time the locals were ready for their encounter with Campbellsville.

The game involved a battle on the boards, fast breaks, and quick ball movement. The game began with the Dragons leading. Gunner Bush used his strength both defensively as well as when scoring offensively.

The local team started in a full-court press defensively and Bobby Landis used his speed to get his first of a number of steals for the Dragons.

Campbellsville Eagle Austin Hash, with his hot shooting, gave Campbellsville a 12-8 lead at the end of the first quarter.

The Dragons kept it close and a shot by Braeden Sluder put Green County in the lead once again during the second quarter, 15-14.

Green County saw their offense stall, and the Eagles capitalized by taking a lead at halftime, 33-18.

A refreshed Dragon team began the second half chipping away at the Eagles' lead with baskets being made, a loose ball recovery by Zyler Bardin and scoring from Bobby Landis that would cut the lead to four, 46-42, in favor of the Eagles in the fourth quarter.

Disaster struck the Dragons when a routine scoring drive by Landis, one he had just completed successfully, turned into a season-ending injury when he landed on

the floor directly on his arm, after the shot.

The Dragons tried to regroup and continued to play hard, but were hampered by the Eagles' success at the free throw line.

As the final seconds ticked off the clock, Campbellsville was able to claim victory, 53-47.

Landis led the team with 14 points and 6 rebounds; he was named to the 5th Region All-A Tournament team and Bardin earned a place on the 5th Region All-A Academic Team. Bardin scored 2 points and had 5 rebounds.

Gunner Bush's inside play garnered him 10 points and 4 rebounds; Davis Rose had 7 points and 4 rebounds; Hunter McCubbins, 6 points and 2 rebounds; Brody Bush, 5 points and 5 rebounds; Braeden Sluder, 3 points and 4 rebounds; and Bardin, 2 points and 5 rebounds.

Campbellsville would go on to advance and claim the 5th Region All 'A' Classic Championship with a 61-46 win over Bethlehem.

The Dragons are scheduled to play Hart County Friday, January 25 in a varsity doubleheader at home. Game time is 7 p.m. following the girls' game at 5:30 p.m. CT

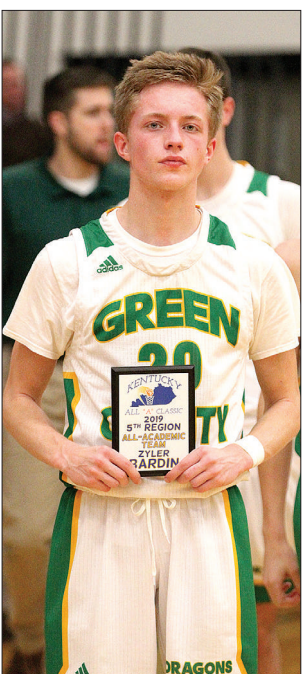

Andrea Patton flips during a time-out. The high school cheer squad has continued to work and increase their difficulty and wow-factor.



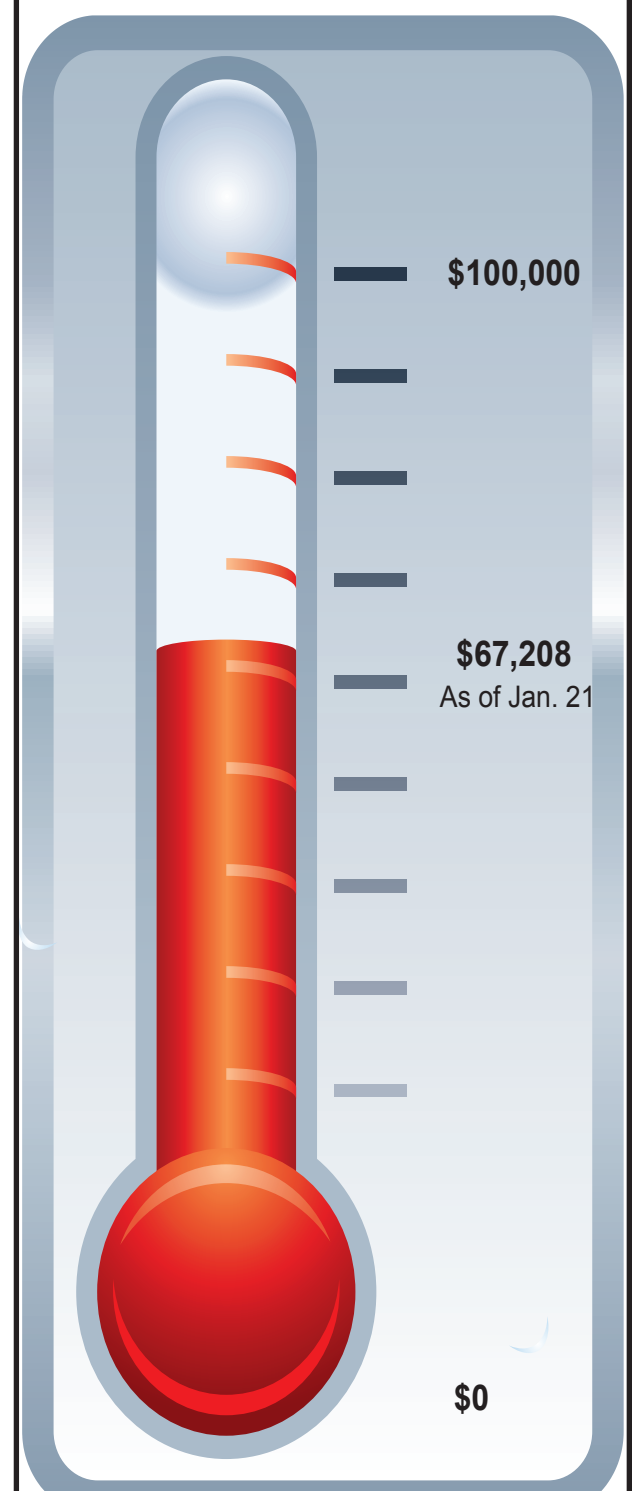
