Darrell Locke, associate professor of social work at Campbellsville University, will speak at the university's chapel on Wednesday, Jan. 30 at 10 a.m. in Ransdell Chapel, 401 N. Hoskins Ave., Campbellsville.

Locke graduated from Campbellsville University in 2000 with a Bachelor's of Social Work and from Western Kentucky University in 2006 with a Master's in Social Work.

He is married to Susan Locke, and they have six children: Benjamin, Isaiah, Laurel, Tristen, Ricky and Jeremiah. They adopted Benjamin, Isaiah and Ricky in 2005.

Locke has served as the president of the National Foster Youth Advisory Council and as co-coordinator of the Kentucky Foster Youth Advisory Council.

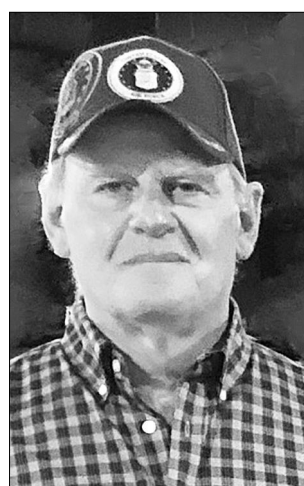

A Children's Crusade?

Historians disagree about precisely what occurred during the Children's Crusade, but the outlines of what happened are fairly clear. In the year 1212, groups of children from Europe journeyed to the Holy Land, ostensibly to convert the Muslims who were then in control. Historians think there may have been several movements of destitute wanderers, with children among the adults. Whatever the details of the Children's Crusade of 1212, we see similar movements of wandering children today. In mid-2018, Syrian refugee camps in Jordan, Turkey and Lebanon contained over a million school-age children. At our southern border with Mexico, children often show up alone or with their parents, mostly from violence-ravaged countries such as Honduras, El Salvador and Guatemala. The media focuses largely on displaced people showing up at or crossing international borders, but millions of refugees do not have the means to leave their country and are considered "internally displaced refugees." People who are desperate enough to flee their homes undoubtedly have good reason to do so. The Christian response to these unfortunate people should certainly be to help them. One way to directly help them would be to open your home to a refugee or asylum seeker (assuming you have an extra room). You might also volunteer your time to teach English to refugees in your area or employ them in your business. Perhaps the easiest way to help them is by donating to organizations such as UNHCR, UNICEF, Catholic Charities, or other well-run aid organizations. - Christopher Simon
