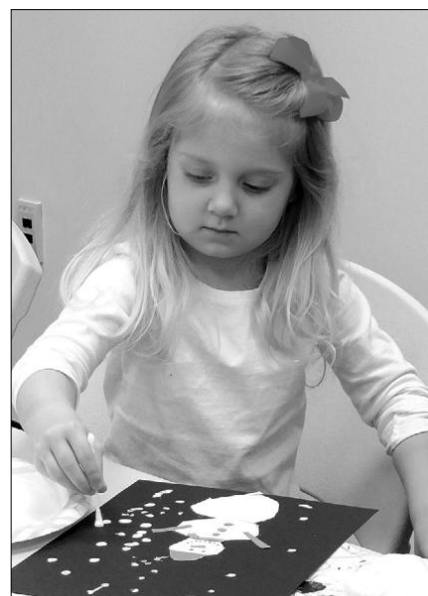
## 157th anniversary event
