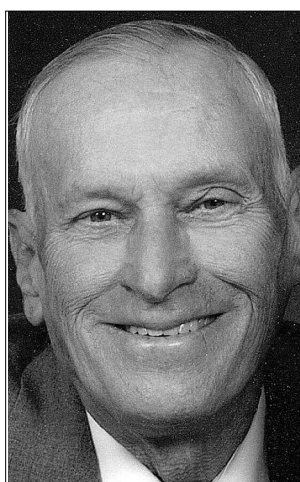
Carl Wayne Pickett, 79
