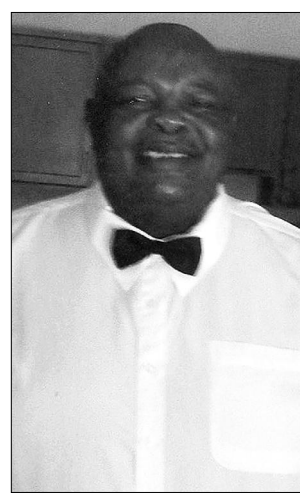
**Logan Smith, 66**

**Willard Malone, 76**

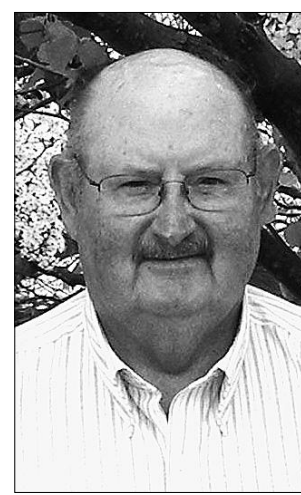
