

Green County High School Cheerleaders brought home first place honors from The Battle Zone Cheer and Dance Competition held at Heritage Hall in Lexington over the weekend.

GCHS Cheerleaders competed against 15 teams in their session Saturday morning. Their 2.5 minute routine incorporated a one-minute cheer, stunts, tumbling, jumps and a choreographed dance.

The 13-member competition squad, under the direction of Coach Kesha Bagby and Assistant Coach Susan Squires, has worked on their routine since July, practicing twice weekly. They revamped the routine in November when they added male cheerleader and stuntman Taybren Manners.

"It always feels great to bring back a winning trophy and it feels amazing to say you won, especially as a senior!" Cheer Captain Kirsten Whitlow said.

Coach Kesha Bagby says the group has overcome their share of obstacles this season when one cheerleader moved to another school shortly after school began and another member quit the squad just before Regional Competition in November. There have also been multiple minor injuries and sickness to plague the squad, she said.

"I'm very proud of this group of cheerleaders this season," Assistant Coach Susan Squires said. "They have had many obstacles to overcome; however, they never once gave up. They continued to stay focused and worked so hard due to their determination to bring home the win. This group has been amazing to work with."

This was the last competition for the school year, as their season ends March 1. The new season will begin July 15.

"We are ready to keep climbing the ladder, looking forward to the incoming freshmen and incorporating harder stunts and tumbling skills," she said, "We expect to get better each year!"

Tryouts for next season will be held in April.

As with all things in Green County, student success would not be possible without a strong community supporting them.
