

# Lady Dragons fall to Hart Co.

Another season ended for the Lady Dragons Tuesday, Feb. 19 in an 57-62 upset-loss to the 18th District Tournament host Hart County Lady Raiders.

The game was riddled with Lady Dragon turnovers, but with two minutes left in the game, the Lady Dragons led by 12. A series of events unfolded during the final minutes of the game before the crowd, team, and announcers' eyes. Lady Raiders went on a 17-0 run. Leadscore Kylie Jackson fouled

out, an over-back call against the opponent was missed, and the Lady Raiders nailed their free throws. With 10 seconds remaining, Green County trailed by three points, but the Lady Dragons were unable to pull-off a shot. As the horn sounded, the Lady Dragons season ended abruptly and unexpectedly. Gracie Parrott ended her five year varsity career with a double-double. She scored a team-high 18 points and 12 rebounds to lead the Lady Dragons. Katlyn Milby also finished with a double-double, she scored 12 alongside 11 rebounds. Gracie Thompson, the only Lady Dragon to hit a three-point goal, went 3-3 from the three-point arc along with 2 free throws for 11 points, Jackson-8, Tanlee Hudgins-7, and Kiley McCubbins-1. Grace Patterson finished the game with 3 rebounds. Katlyn Milby and Gracie Parrott were named to the 18th District All-Tournament team. Parrott and Kylie Jackson were named to the 18th District All-Season team.

Sophomore Katlyn Milby shot the highest field goal percentage at 50.9%. McCubbin led the team for the season from the three-point line and proved her shooting range. She finished the season shooting 36.5% for three-point shots, 31/85. Milby and Parrott finished the season with 174 cumulative rebounds, each to be tied for leading rebounder. Jackson, who increased her rebounds per game mid-season, finished with a season total of 143; freshman Hudgins capitalized on every rotation in a game and pulled down 130; Thompson-69, McCubbins-59, Patterson-37, Summer Scott-17, Macie Russell-10, Kate Judd-4, Emma Renfrow-2, Catie Church-1, and Haley Judd-1.

Jackson, who was named to the 5th Region All-Regular Season Team, led the team in scoring for the season. With a total of 462 points on the season, Jackson averaged 15.9 points per game. Jackson also shot an impressive 80.2% from the free throw line. She also recently earned Kentucky.com Girls' Basketball Player of the Week (February 10-16) after she scored 21 points in the Lady Dragons 46-44 win over Campbellsville and 25 points in the Lady Dragons 63-55 win over Thomas Nelson. The sophomore plans to work hard during the off-season and continue to improve.

The Lady Dragons finished their season with a record of 14 wins, 15 losses. Senior Patterson and Parrott will hang up their basketball shoes as they move on to their next adventure. Patterson plans to attend Lindsey Wilher College or Western Kentucky University and major in Pre-Med. Parrott has signed with Campbellsville University where she will play on the golf team and study business before moving on to mortuary school.
