He had made a profession of faith in Christ and was a self-employed logger.

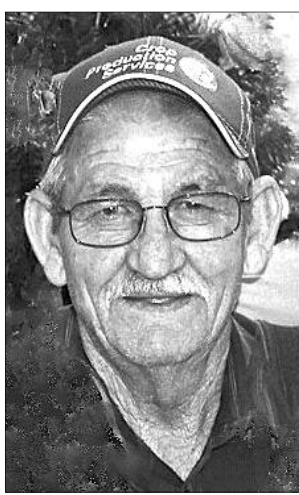
Besides his parents, he was preceded in death by his wife, Loretta Cooper Curry March 27, 1998 having united in marriage March 22, 1960.
