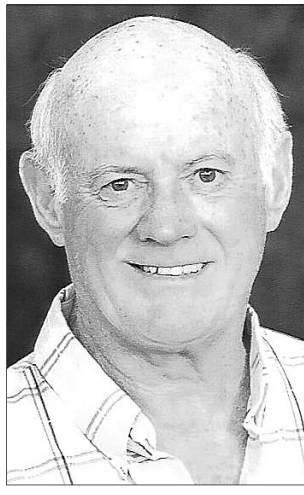


Mike Clark, 63

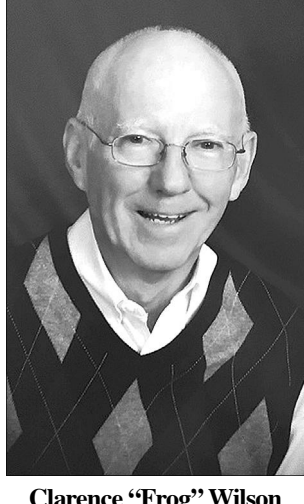
