**The Connection Between Generosity and Prosperity**

Throughout the Old Testament, the Israelites are told that if they keep the Law and follow God's commandments, they will be prosperous. The Book of Joshua is clear on this connection: "Keep this Book of the Law always on your lips; meditate on it day and night, so that you may be careful to do everything written in it. Then you will be prosperous and successful." (Joshua 1:8 NIV) The prophet Malachi tells the Israelites that they are robbing God when they fail to give the full tithe, and God promises to "open the floodgates of heaven" if only the people will "Bring the whole tithe into the storehouse, that there may be food in my house." (Malachi 3:10 NIV) The promise which God makes is that our generosity will be repaid in full. Jesus summarizes this eternal law of human nature: "Do not judge, and you will not be judged. Do not condemn, and you will not be condemned. Forgive, and you will be forgiven. Give, and it will be given to you." (Luke 6:37-38 NIV) The apostle Paul reminds the Corinthians that stinginess and generosity have consequences as natural as the fruits which follow from their seeds: "Remember this: Whoever sows sparingly will also reap sparingly, and whoever sows generously will also reap generously." (2 Corinthians 9:6 NIV) We should not, however, be generous as an insurance policy or an investment plan. Give from a pure motive to help others, and realize that the reward may be in a different coin, as it were.
