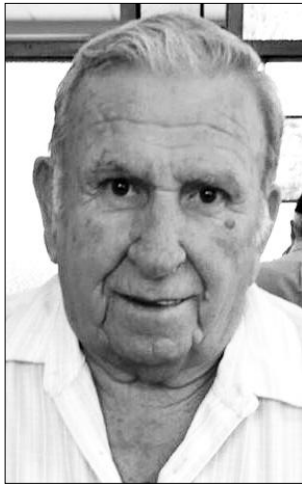
Phillip Dale Robertson, 78

Special singing will be held each night.

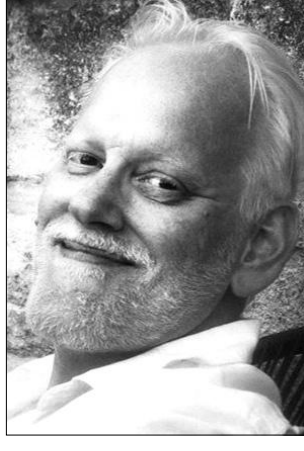
