Judge meets voters - Forty-one people attended a meeting at Summersville to discuss issues with Green County Judge-Executive Mary Ann Blaydes Baron.

Lightning strikes WGRK - The voice of Green River country, WGRK-FM, was silenced for several hours when a lightning strike destroyed vital equipment.

Wreck injures two - Carla Burton and her two-year-old son, Tyler, were injured when Burton's vehicle slid off the rain-slick pavement of Winding Stair Hill.

Gate station robbed - Thieves took numerous cartons of cigarettes from a storage building at Gate Service Station.

April 6, 1989
Parking meters to be removed - City employees began removing approximately 200 parking meters after the City Council voted to have them removed.

Lottery tickets selling - The sale of Kentucky Lottery tickets began Tuesday with many winners in the area.

School royalty - Jon Jeffries and Beth Hodges were chosen GCHS Prom King and Queen. The king and queen of the Pierce Spring Festival were Brian Ervin and Janet Wilson. Chosen for prince and princess were Adam Davis and Sara Matthews.

history project - The fifth grade social studies students at GES had a display of history projects at the Green County Public Library. On display were log buildings, a replica of Ft. Boonesboro, quilts, a covered wagon and an Indian camp site.

April 12, 1979
'No' vote to union - Employees of Greensburg Manufacturing Company voted against unionization.

Appeal denied - An appeal by local businessmen to stop abandonment of the rail service to Greensburg has been denied.

Hog inventory increases - The March 1, 1979 inventory of hogs and pigs on Kentucky farms numbered 1,160,000 head. This number is up 14 percent over 1978.

April 10, 1969
City plans parking lot - The city has purchased the lot adjacent to City Hall, which is the location of the stone building formerly known as Old Stone House Antiques. A parking lot to accommodate 20-22 cars is planned.

Museum at Old Courthouse - The Green County Histori-

cal Society is planning to set up a museum in the Old Courthouse.
