A year of change, moved positions, loss of teammates, and adversity have not slowed the Lady Dragons in their journey.

The Lady Dragons traveled to Caverna Monday, March 25 and out-batted and out-pitched the Lady Colonels. A win was evident after only five innings with the Lady Dragons first shut-out of the season.

Tatum Caulk started on the mound for the Lady Dragons. The middle school pitcher struck out eight Lady Colonels, walked one, and only allowed three hits in the five innings. The game was textbook for the Lady Dragons with zero errors committed.

The Lady Dragons batting practice has proved successful as they picked up a total of 16 hits.

Haley Judd, Tanglee Hudgins and Madi Corbin led the team with three hits a piece. Hudgins picked up her first home run of her

varsity career. Katlyn Milby stayed moving with three stolen bases. Tuesday, March 26 the Lady Dragons hosted Elizabethtown. With a close game, the Lady Dragons trailed at one moment, but rallied their bats to overtake the lead by one run and win 8-7.

Corbin credits her savior for their ongoing success and mentality about the game.

"Your talent is God's gift to you," said Corbin. "What you do with it, is your gift back to God."

Saturday, the Lady Dragons traveled to Taylor County early in the morning and earned two more wins

to move them to an 8-1 record on the season, 6-0 in Region, and 4-0 in District. They snuck past Butler, 5-4 and defeated the Taylor County Lady Cards, 10-4.

The Lady Dragons return to the field for games April 8 when they host Caverna. They travel to North Hardin April 9.

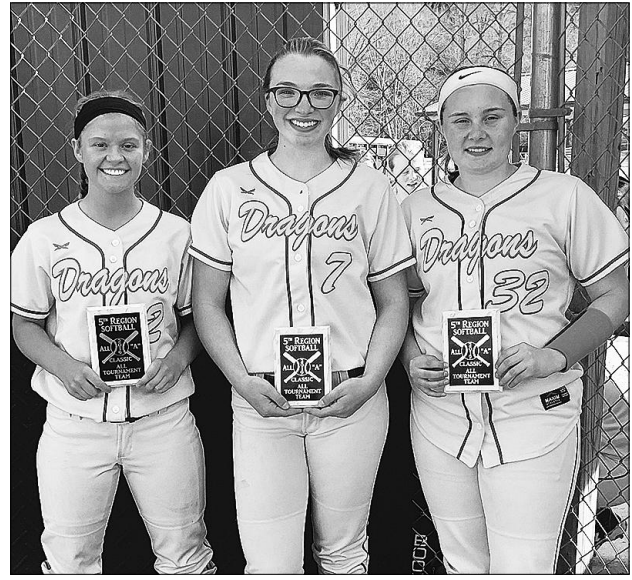

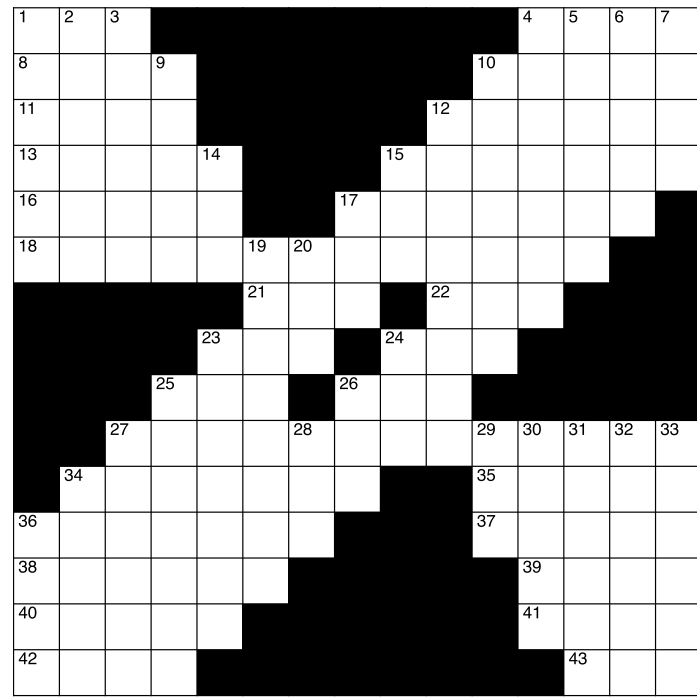
