"I campaigned on working with Jane Todd to find a way to build their facility,' Shuffett said of a new hospital.

The mayor has an objective of providing an after-school program for Green County Middle and High School youth at the community center.

'It's a goal. It's a possibility. It's something we can prioritize."

Mayor Shuffett talked about increasing the city's revenue by enlarging the local water plant's output as a way to fund future city operations and projects.

He commented that there are citizens' concerns regarding local commerce.

"The free market will always rule the day. The market will dictate what happens."

The mayor mentioned the developers who own the Fred's facility and a lot are interested in seeing the building occupied.

He also said city and county government officials, and community leaders as well, have reached out to grocers throughout the state of Kentucky and other states to bring a grocery establishment to the community.
