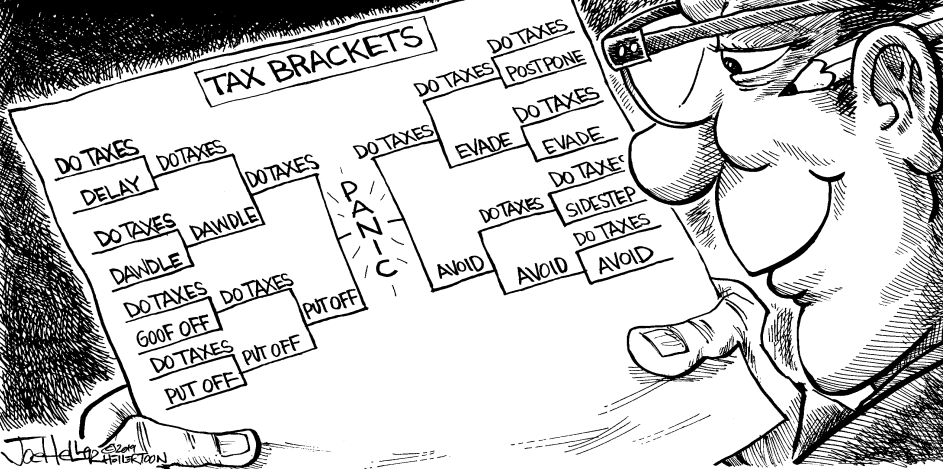
### GCHD Diabetes Education

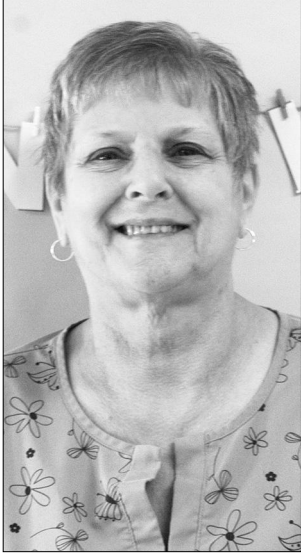

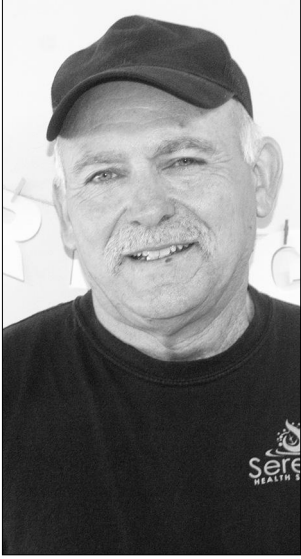
