

# Track and Field teams finish in top four

The Green County Varsity Girls' and Boys' Track and Field teams placed in the top four Friday at the Lindsey Wilson College Blue Raider Rumble in Columbia.

The Lady Dragons finished third and the Dragons, fourth.

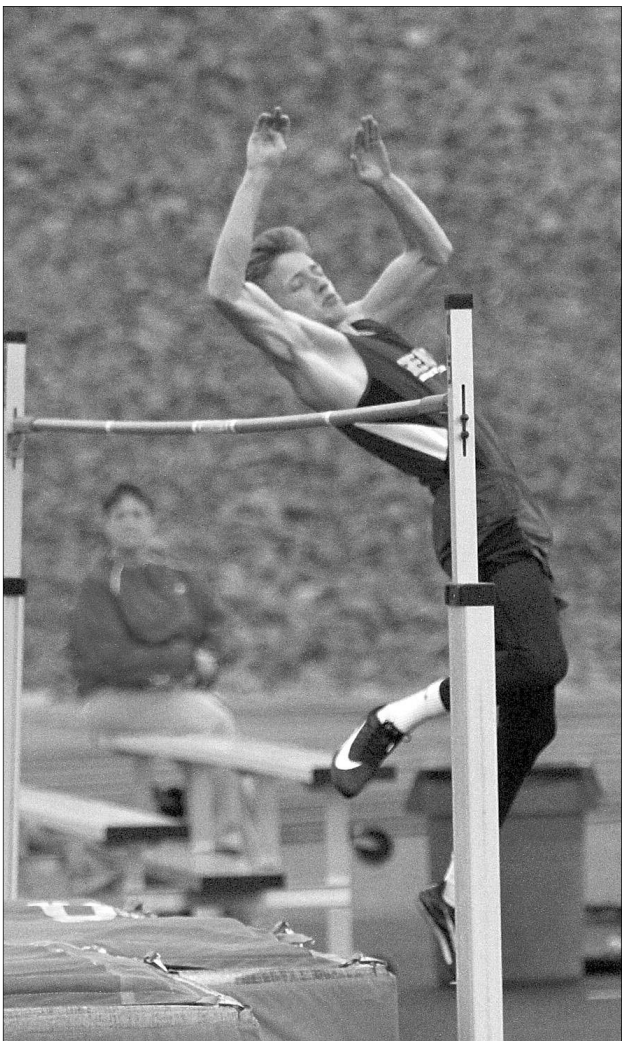

Continuing to dominate in throwing events, Nathan Ray placed first in shot put with a distance of 45'7" and first in discus by more than 19' with a throw of 154'8." Ray was 1" shy of breaking his own school record in discus.



Freshman Emma Renfrow scored in both hurdle events for the Lady Dragons. Renfrow placed fourth in the 100m hurdle with a time of 19.35 and came from behind in the 300m hurdles for a third place finish with a time of 55.36. The Lady Dragons scored 69.5 points for a solid third place team finish.

For the boys, they finished fourth, scoring 73 points. North Laurel High was victorious with 99. There were 16 girl teams and 15 boy teams that scored in the meet. "I'm definitely proud of our teams. The boys had eight PR's and four wins, while the girls finished with nine PR's. We were missing a few boys that would have done well in the competition and we had some girls (in new events) compete very well," said Head Coach Dan Knoy. "Everyone is gaining valuable experience and improving their marks. We even have a few trying new events to help the team however they can. That's what I love to see." The next scheduled meet is Saturday at the Clash of the Classes hosted by Bardstown High School.
