Mark B. Chandler, 92

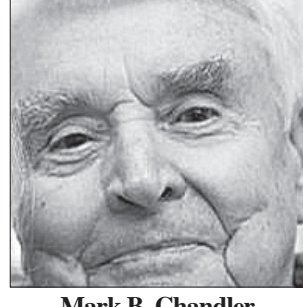
