

Dragons hosted Hart, travel to LaRue

After a 15-7 loss against the Hawks of LaRue County April 15 at home, the Dragons tightened up their defense and continued to add big hits for the remainder of the week and added two more wins in the books.

Green Co. (10) vs. Washington Co. (0) April 16

Green County hosted Washington County Tuesday, April 16. Jackson Johnson pitched a no-no with four strikeouts in five innings. Dragon defense covered ground to ensure the opponent's offense was spoiled. Outfielders Dennis Rose and Jacob Scott made big catches in right and center field. Scott finished with three. Gunner Bush led the team with four put-outs. Second baseman Isaac Young, short-stop Kellen Whitlow, and first baseman Bryce Blakeman worked together to make a textbook double play to end the top of the fourth inning.

A number of Dragons finished the game with a successful night at the plate. Rose led the team with three RBI's from a single and a double. Blakeman had

three singles, a total of two RBI's. Freshman Young also had two hits on the night.

Green Co. (5) vs. Monroe Co. (4) April 17

It was a game that proved a no-quit attitude for the Dragons against the Monroe County Falcons April 17. The Dragons were the away team on the scoreboard and at the end of the first inning were down 0-1.

Johnson singled in the top of the second

inning; Blakeman and Braeden Sluder both scored. The Dragons took the 2-1 lead. The Falcons traded swings and tied the game 2-2 in the bottom of the second and in the bottom of the third scored two additional runs to lead 4-2.

Green Co. (7) vs. Russell Co. (8) April 22

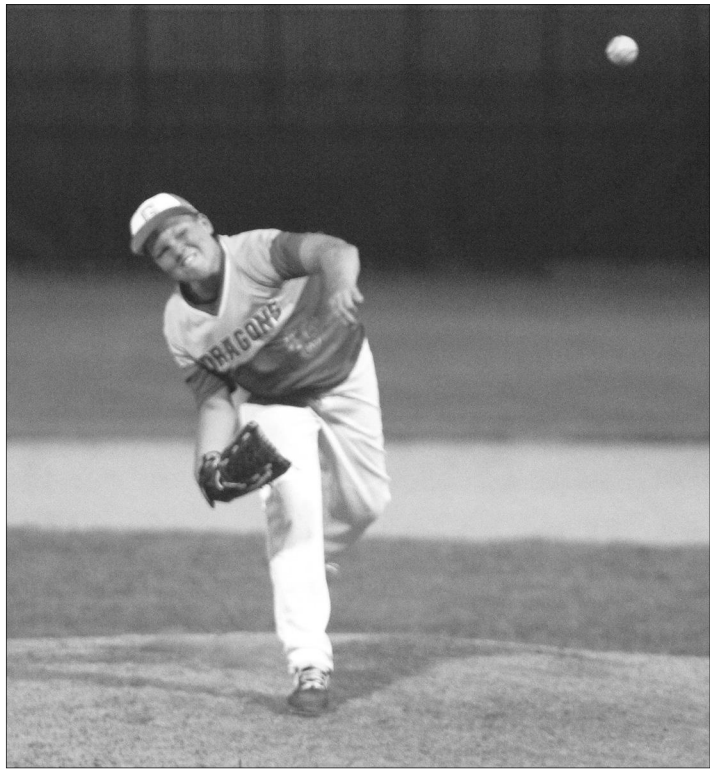
