

Waste Tire event begins tomorrow

Green County residents are invited to dispose of old tires during the annual Waste Tire Collection event May 30 through June 1. The collection will be held at the Kentucky Department of Highway's ga-

rage, 521 Columbia Highway. The event, hosted by Green County Fiscal Court in cooperation with the Division of Waste Management, invites

residents to dispose of tires at no charge.

Tires will be accepted in a variety of formats, including on or off the rim, farm implemented, bicycle, motorcycle, go-cart, ATV, tractor, truck or passenger tires.

Tires that are foam filled or calcium filled will not be accepted. Off-road construction or any tire with a bead greater than 1.75 inches will not be accepted.

Eligible participants do not include tire retailers or salvage yards. Tires should not be brought in enclosed
