He married Lohmann Claudene Rayburn Wednesday, May 28, 1958 at 6 p.m.

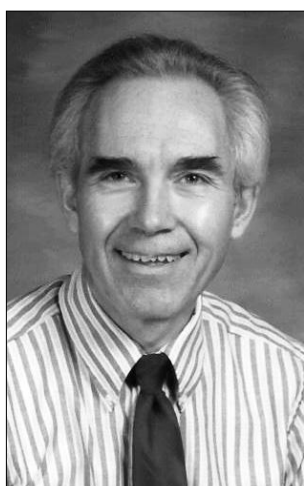

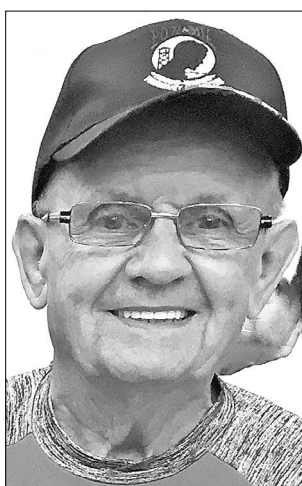
William Eudean Workman, 82

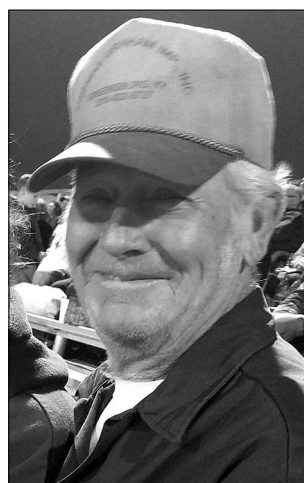
Wayne Graham, 70
