

Census Bureau seeking workers for 2020

The 2020 Census is fast approaching and the Census Bureau is hiring to help count the current population. According to a Census Bureau representative, if interested in part time flexible work, this would be a great opportunity to earn extra money while helping the county obtain more federal money.

Visit the address <https://2020census.gov/jobs> to fill out an application and to seek more information about the job. These jobs start in early August and are part time flexible; pay is \$14 per hour and 58 cents a mile. To be eligible for a 2020 Census job, you must: Be at least 18

years old, have a valid Social Security number, be a U.S. citizen, and have a valid email address. Applicants must complete an application and answer assessment questions; they must be registered with the Selective Service System or have a qualifying exemption, if you are a male born

after Dec. 31, 1959. Applicants must pass a Census-performed criminal background check and a review of criminal records, including fingerprinting, commit to completing training and be available to work flexible hours, which can include days, evenings, and/or weekends. Most jobs require

employees to have access to a vehicle and a valid driver's license, have access to a computer with internet and an email account (to complete training). If employed elsewhere, applicant's current job must be compatible with Census Bureau employment and not create conflicts of interest. These will

be reviewed on a case-by-case basis. Also, applicants must not engage in any partisan political activity while on duty. The Census Bureau is an equal opportunity employer. The more accurate the count, the more government money will come in to the county for schools, hospitals, roads and more.

"I can tell you personally that I have changed a lot and this community has changed by getting involved in Rotary. We have a park that was built with district grant money and with Greensburg Rotary uniting with the city to fund the park.

When local clubs achieve at a high level they become eligible for attractive matching funds from Rotary.

"Funds from the district made it possible for our club to grant \$5,000, instead of just \$2,000, in scholarships," Stearman recalled.

"When a Rotarian donates \$1,000 and becomes a Paul Harris Fellow, that money can prevent at least 1,000 kids from getting polio, or to provide clean water where there is none."

Donations to Rotary also provide textbooks in schools. Stearman recalled seeing kids in a school in Jamaica using three pages stapled together because there were no textbooks until Rotary provided them.

"You are making a difference," he said.

He reminded Rotarians that they are among the 1.2 million Rotary members worldwide, in 36,000 clubs. In 2018 they completed 30,000 projects and put in 111.1 million volunteer hours and raised over \$414 million for humanitarian causes.

"That is really what serving is all about."

The elegant July 2 event was hosted by

Bill and Justine Landrum and the Longhunters staff.

Landrum, a past president of the Greensburg club, returned from duties in Frankfort as Kentucky's Secretary of Finance and Administration Cabinet, to participate in the activities.

He welcomed the invited guests and said "We are honored that you would come here. You all have made a difference. Without people like you, Rotary would not exist and I want to thank you sincerely for the comfort you give to others with your donations and your spirit."

Landrum said he and Justine enjoy serving guests at Longhunters Coffee and Tea which opened over seven years ago.

Rotarian Joe McWilliams, auctioned off two items to raise money for the Rotarian Foundation to fund humanitarian projects worldwide.

A fifth of rare Elmer T. Lee bourbon brought \$600 and a pink flamingo \$425. This is the second time the District has auctioned the Flamingo named Ester. So far he has raised over \$975 for the Foundation.

The event closed with "The Four way test of the things we think, say or do.

Is it the truth.

Is it fair to all concerned.

Will it build goodwill and better friendship.

Will it be beneficial to all concerned."
