Greensburg is in the **Rotary Club spotlight**

Evansville, Knoxville, Louisville, Bowling Green, Danville, Elizabethtown, Frankfort, Murray, Paducah, Scottsville, Columbia, LaGrange, Mayfield, Prospect, Russellville, Lexington and Georgetown.

Longhunters Coffee and Tea Co. was packed Tuesday night July 2 with one or more Rotarians from each of these locations.

All had the Rotary motto "Service Above Self" in mind.

All were in Greensburg for the installation of Otha Ray Stearman as District 6710 Governor.

To realize the significance of this event, consider that District Governors usually come from the largest of the 55 clubs in the district. The last four have come from Elizabethtown, Paducah and two from the 400 plus member Louisville club which is the 14th largest club in the nation.

Stearman is only the second District Governor from the Greensburg Club. John H. Ewing, Jr. held that position in 1974.

As District Governor. Otha Ray and wife Nancy will be ambassadors for Greensburg while visiting all 55 Rotary Clubs in the western half of Kentucky. Stearman is on a mission to "Grow Rotary" by increasing the 2,700 members in the district to 3,000 and establish three new clubs.

He credited the Record-Herald for raising market awareness for Rotary and the local club

"When you are a small community, the newspaper can make a big difference," he said. "Coming from a small town has given me a different dynamic.

"When a club gets up to 40-50 members in a town the size of Greensburg, it isn't just the size of the town, it is the heart of your people."

In his introductory remarks, Joe Shuffett recalled the ups and downs since he joined Rotary in 1967.

"In 2004 when we met in the Greensburg Fire Dept building," Shuffett said, "attendance was often in the single digits." Gradually attendance increased and after Stearman became President a new enthusiasm more than doubled the membership. "People enjoyed coming and participating, Shuffett recalled. "We won three awards and were the Rotary Club of the year. District personnel also noted the enthusiasm and

put Otha Ray in line to be District Governor."

Greensburg Mayor John Shuffett was among the many Stearman singled out that night.

"You have to have the Mayor on board," he said. "Since John Shuffett was elected he has done a great job and he has boosted Rotary. I want to thank him for being here tonight. In fact, I want to thank everyone for being here."

He called attention to many in the crowd, especially those who had driven from places as far away as Knoxville.

"I wouldn't drive that far to hear me!" he said with a chuckle.

While describing the recent trip he and Nancy made to attend Rotary functions in Germany and adjoining countries, he noted how Rotarians develop friendships worldwide. "The new vision is," he said, "Together we see a world where people unite and take action to create lasting change-across the globe, in our communities, and in ourselves."


