

City approves revised Golf Cart Ordinance

The Greensburg City Council, meeting in regular session Monday evening, amended an ordinance permitting the use of golf carts on designated public road-

ways within the City of Greensburg.

The City Council also approved an ordinance establishing the amount of salaries and compensation to be paid to all city employees for fiscal year 2019-2020.

After listening to an

audit presentation by Drew Ulmer of Baldwin CPAs, Richmond, Council members voted to accept the favorable report pertaining to the city's finances for the fiscal year ending in 2018.

"It is encouraging to

receive a positive report from the auditors," said Mayor John Shuffett. "The responsible management of the city's revenues and programs is our top priority and this audit confirms that."

Mayor Shuffett spoke about ServLine, a unique

water leak protection program which features coverage of water loss with no deductible and provides an option to repair or replace a customer's water or sewer line.

The Council authorized the mayor to pro-

ceed toward the implementation of the water leak protection program to be determined at a later date.

"We feel this leak protection program will be a valuable service to our customers," said Shuffett.
