Local businesses and property owners stepped up and helped us as soon as the need was addressed.

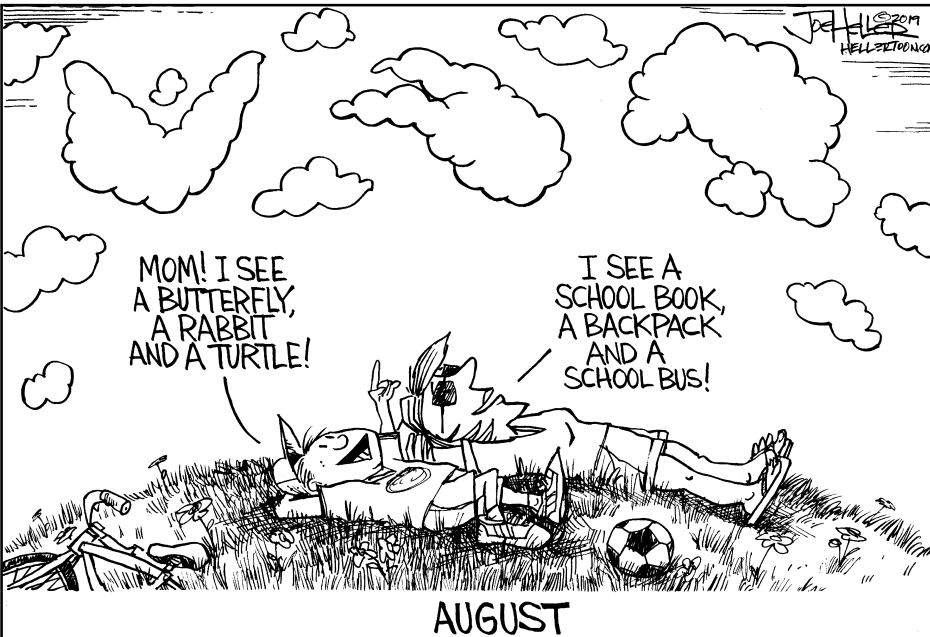
What we witnessed is that we do have some common goals here and can succeed when there is a respect for our community members and when we embrace the ideas and efforts of others.

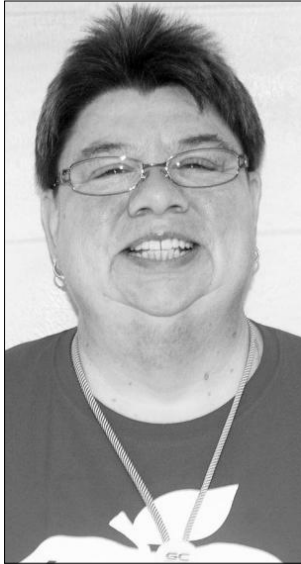
