# Dragons fall to Hart despite close first half

It was an exciting evening inside Dragon Stadium Friday. Green County played host to Hart County Raiders.

Intensity continued to build as the time clock ticked down each quarter. At half-time the score stood 20-22; Dragons trailed by only two points.

The Raiders edged out the Dragons in the second half and secured their 50-28 win and moved to 2-1.

The score indicated a win for the Raiders on paper, but the Dragons won as well as they continued to show improvement from the previous week. Zack Ferguson completed a touchdown pass to Taybren Manners, the team's rushing yards increased, the line held strong and allowed for more pass completions, and the number of tackles increased in

cluded: Jonas Abbott-1, Josh Higgins-1, Jack Hessig-3, Nathan Davis-6, Jason Ferari-4, Harley Montgomery-4, Calen Squires-2, Taybren Manners-2, Cole Edmonds-4, Jaden Pierce-3, Chayse York-1, Layke Pickett-1, Tayvion Mitchell-1, and Dillon Poynter-1.

The offense followed through against the Raiders and capitalized to complete a number of touchdowns.

Ferari rushed for 172 yards and scored two touchdowns. York rushed for 106 yards and scored a touchdown for the Dragons. Grey, and Ferguson also picked up rushing yards. Squires, Grey, Manners, Davis, and Houchens all made clean catches throughout the game to pick up big yards.

The Dragons look forward to this Friday night. Dragons host 3-0 Taylor County Cards at 7 p.m. CT.

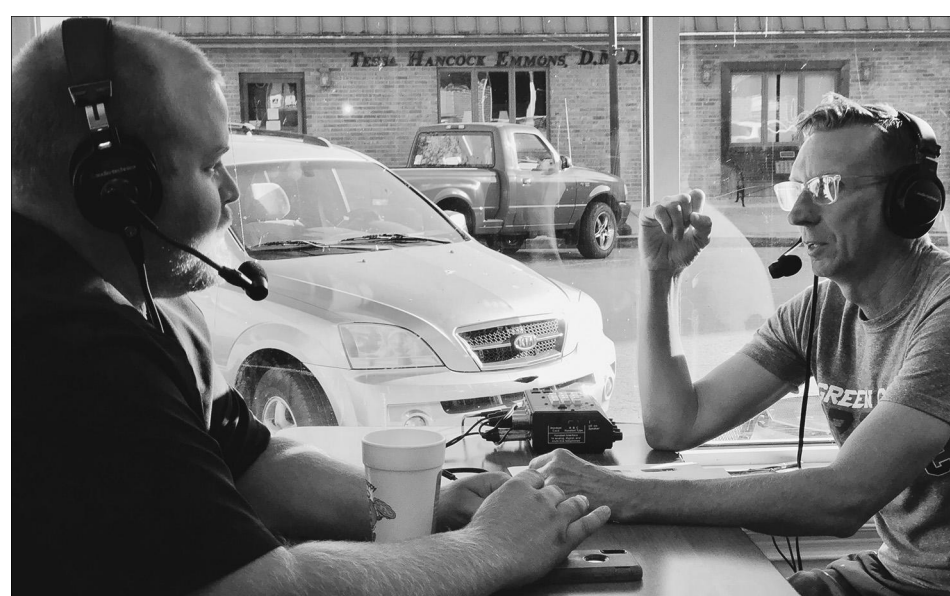
