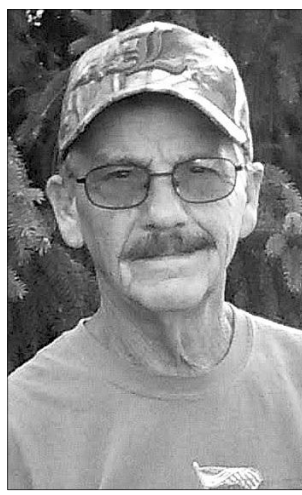
Carl Kenneth Rogers, Jr., 65
