Parrott claims second tourney victory for CU

In a span of five days, freshman Gracie Parrott has claimed her second tournament victory coming from behind to win the Bill Bockwitz Spring Arbor University Fall Clas-

Parrott and the Lady Tigers played 36-holes on Monday and she sat in a tie for second place with scores of 75 and 67. The 67 matches her career-low which was set last week at the NCCAA Mid-East Region. In the final round, Parrott fired a two-under 70 to jump Taylor University's Nicole Jung on the leaderboard winning by two strokes.

The consecutive victories have happened only three times in program history as fellow Green County product Cassidy Scantland won back-to-back tournaments in April 2014 and Lauren Scholl won a pair of tournaments in 2006.

With the two victories, Parrott still has a way to go to match Scantland's six wins during her rookie season. The two wins now rank her fifth in program history with the most victories in a ca-
