According to a Frankfort press release about the general accountability system information, the star ratings and federal classifications are based on 2018-2019 K-PREP assessment data and other indicators released today by the Kentucky Department of Education. The system does not rely solely on students' proficiency on state standardized examinations. The accountability indicators that factor into a school's overall five-star rating include:
