The event will kick off Friday, Oct. 11 with a gospel singing program starting at 5 p.m. CT and running to 9 p.m. under the big tent at the Summersville School Grounds. Scheduled performers are New Waters Choir, New Waters Bluegrass Gospel Band, Oak Forest Church Youth with special songs by Ginny Hodges, Danielle Milby, and Jordan Anthony, other guests include: Ruth Warren, Tracey Lewis and daughter Ann-Michael Tucker, Through the Fire, and possibly other guests.

The gospel concert is free; a love offering will be taken up to as the SVFD's annual gospel benefit has been combined with Summersville Fun Days.

Co-ed softball games will begin at the Summersville Ball Park, behind the old school building, at 6 p.m. State Representative Brandon Reed will open the games with prayer.

A country ham breakfast will begin at 5 a.m. and the SVFD building and volunteers will serve until all the ham is gone.

continue after 7 a.m. with the Summersville Fun Run/Walk starting at 8 a.m. at the Green County Cellular (formerly the bank).

Car, tractor and antique/gasoline engine owners can begin registering at 8 a.m. in the field adjacent to the school, across from TMart. The event will be open for viewing all day with final judging at 1 p.m.

Quilt show drop-offs

will be from 8 a.m. to 9:30 a.m. in the vacant side of Debbie's Angel Soft Laundromat. Public viewing and voting will begin at 10 a.m. with final judging at 12 p.m. Pickup is promptly at 12 p.m.

The SVFD will bring cooking lunch by 9 a.m. and will serve all day and into the evening. The menu will consist of ribeye or fish sandwiches, hot dogs, slaw, fries, ribbon taters,

fried apple pies and more. Carry-outs are available at anytime.

The Hula Hoop Contest will begin at 9:30 a.m. under the tent, near the car/tractor show, beside of the school building. The free event is open to any child or adult and participants should bring their own hula hoop. First and second place trophies will be given to the last two standing, along with a

\$25 and \$15 Walmart gift card, respectively.

The Greensburg Police Department booth will be open from 10 a.m. to 2 p.m. with special items for adult-accompanied children. Their booth will be under the big auction tent on the school grounds.

Quilt Show

The annual Summersville Fun Days Quilt Show will be from 8 a.m. to 12 p.m. CT Saturday, Oct. 12.

This year the quilt show will be held inside of the empty building adjacent to Debbie's Angel Soft Laundromat.

There is no entry fee for this event and any and all entries are welcome. In addition, this event is open to everyone, not just to those who live in the Summersville community.

Quilt entries may be dropped off from 8 to 9:30 CT. Viewing and voting will be from 10 a.m. to 12 p.m.

The quilt does not have to have been made by the person entering the quilt into the event, nor does it have to be a new quilt.

Participants are encouraged to enter quilts with a history or that have a special sentimental value.

In order to avoid having to make the difficult choice of which of their favorite quilts to enter, more

than one quilt can be entered by the same person.

Participants can rest assured their treasured quilts will not be left unattended at any time during the day's display. The chairperson in charge of the quilt show will be present throughout the entire event.

There will be two winners for Crowd's Choice.

It will be the top two choices made by the spectators of their two most favorite quilts. This is determined by the number of votes cast by the spectators coming into the show and viewing the quilts on display.

There will be one winner chosen for Judge's Choice for best overall quilt.

The judges for this event will be individuals who were selected prior to Oct. 12 and who will have no prejudice to any particular entry.

The final judging will be completed prior to 12 p.m.

Prompt pick up of the quilts is encouraged.

Again this year there will be a drawing for a hand pieced quilt top; this drawing will only be for those participants entering a quilt into the event.

Each person who enters a quilt will be given one ticket for a chance at winning the quilt top. The winner will be notified at the time of quilt pick up.

"We are looking forward to seeing lots of beautiful quilts, so make plans now as to which quilts you want to enter," said Pam Perkins, with Summersville Fun Days.

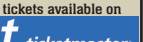
