

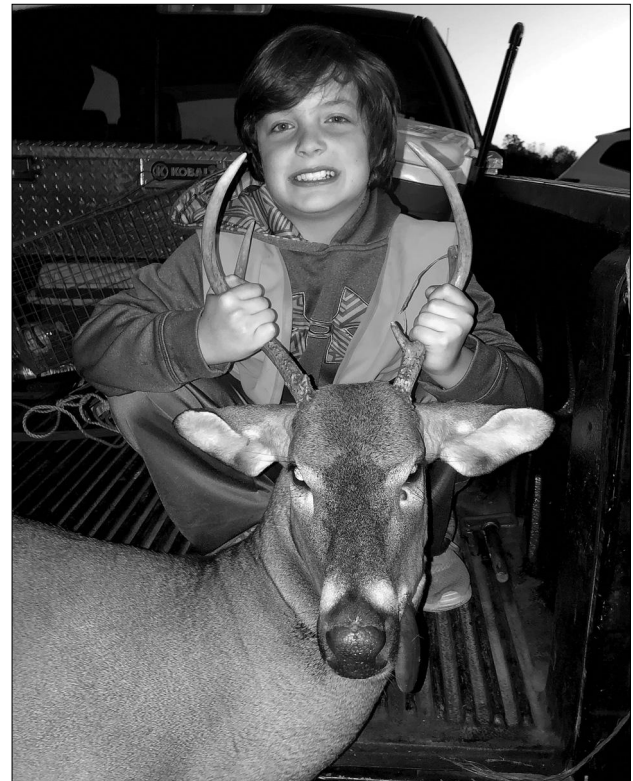
# Youth deer season is officially open

The five teams who have already signed up include Forcht Bank, the Green County Sheriff's Department, the Green County Clerk's office, ASARC (Adanta Sexual Assault Resource Center) and Green County Career Center.

The Sheriff's Department, Career Center and ASARC have men who are signed up to be part of the team and they too will be running in heels.

Each team member will run one-fourth of the race in heels and then hand off a handbag or purse to the next person on the team who will run the next leg of the race until all four team members have run.

All fans who show up to watch the race will

be considered for the Big Fan Award.

Bluegrass Cellular is providing a prize to the winner of the Big Fan Award.

"We want people to dress up, show up in heels, whatever they can do to support the teams," Landis said.

Other businesses have also jumped on board to provide incentives for participating in the race. Subway is giving a 10% discount to all the participants in the race and Time-Out is providing pizza as well as their party room for the awards recognition. Kroger is also providing bottled water for all racers.
