

**James Glen Posey, 74**

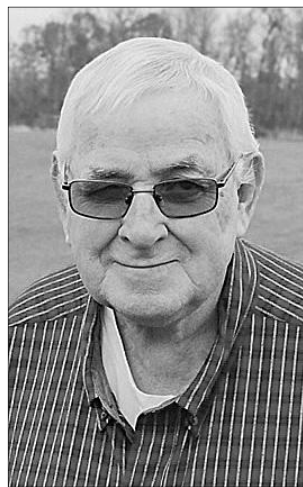

**Garland Wilson Harris, 84**

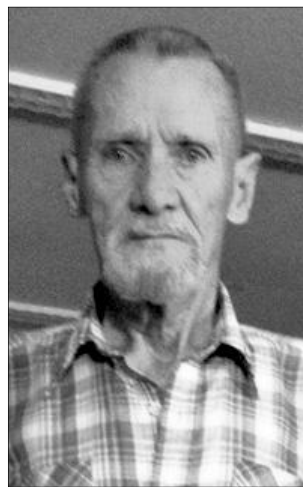
