The Green County Grand Jury returned indictments against eight men and one woman at its October 16 regular monthly session.

Mark Lobb, 49, 740 Summersville Coakley Rd., was indicted on one count of possession of methamphetamine. The charge stems from an alleged incident May 24. Bond is \$5000.

Sidebottom, 30, 512 Douglas Alley, Elizabethtown, was indicted on one count each of trafficking in marijuana while in possession of a firearm, possession of drug paraphernalia, possession of a third-degree unspecified controlled substance and a controlled substance prescription not in original container. The charges stem from an alleged incident May 30. Bond is \$2000.

William Barfield, 35, 468 Chestnut Ridge Rd., was indicted on eight counts

of an illegal sex act with a victim under 16 years old, seven counts of incest and one count of first-degree sexual abuse. The charges stem from alleged incidents between October 2013 and August 2019. Bond is \$25,000.

Michael J Townsend, 28, 3273 Marshall Ridge Rd., was indicted on one count of first-degree sexual abuse. The charge stems from an alleged incident between July 2017 and June 2018. Bond is \$5000.

Mary K. Underwood, 21, 104 North McCullum Ave., was indicted on one count each of tampering with physical evidence, possession of drug paraphernalia, possession of a second-degree unspecified controlled substance and prescription not in original container. The charges stem from alleged incident August 16. Bond is \$5000.

The Green County Fiscal Court, in a regular called meeting Oct. 17, voted to contribute \$1,500 each to the Greensburg, Green County, Summersville, Exie, and Grab fire departments.

"The Court appreciates all the fire departments. This is one way that we can help out and assist the departments with their operating expenses," said Judge-Executive John Frank.

Magistrates also approved to provide health insurance for a part-time deputy court clerk and agreed to a resolution listing all county roads in the county road system, amended to delete Sanford Bailey Road from the system.

Judge-Executive Frank informed the Court that the cost of the Russell Creek Bridge project has been reduced to \$562,000.

Post 15 hosts Prescription Take-Back on Saturday

The Kentucky State Police Post 15, Columbia will be participating in the DEA National Prescription Drug Take-Back Day to be held Saturday, Oct. 26 from 10 a.m. to 2 p.m. CT.

The collection point will be located a Kentucky State Police Post 15, located at 1118 Jamestown Street, Columbia.

All citizens that wish to participate may dispose of their current or outdated unwanted medication either in its original container or by removing the medication from its con-

tainer and disposing of it directly into the disposal box. If an original container is submitted, the individual should remove any identifying information from the prescription label.

All solid dosage pharmaceutical products and liquids in consumer containers may be accepted. Liquid products, such as cough syrup, should remain sealed in their original container. The depositor should ensure that the cap is tightly sealed to prevent leakage.

Intravenous solutions, injectable medications, and syringes will not be accepted due to the potential hazard posed by blood borne pathogens.

Illicit substances such as marijuana or methamphetamine are not a part of this initiative and should not be placed in collection containers.

At the conclusion of the event, the Kentucky State Police will seal the drug disposal boxes in accordance with agency policy and procedure and store them until turned over to the DEA.
