The Dragons finished second to Bethlehem, scoring 49 points.

Bethlehem High tallied 35.

The Lady Dragons placed fourth, accumulating 75 points.

Owensboro Catholic won region with 40.

For the boys, Mason Stone led the team, finishing second overall with a time of 17:14.67 in the 5K run.

Also scoring were: 3. Zach Jewell - 17:44.37, 9. Jayden Marr -18:27.62, 18. Gage Cornett - 19:18.76, and 19. Houston Hodges -19:22.11.
