

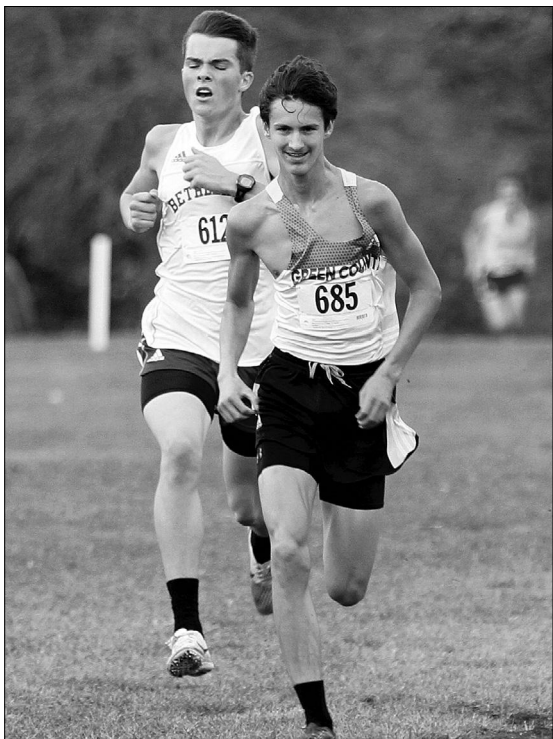

# Cross Country qualifies for state

The Green County Girls' and Boys' Cross Country teams qualified for the state meet as a result of their finish Saturday in the Class A Region 2 meet at Ephraim White Park in Bowling Green.

The Dragons finished second to Bethlehem, scoring 49 points. Bethlehem High tallied 35.

The Lady Dragons placed fourth, accumulating 75 points.

Owensboro Catholic won region with 40.

For the boys, Mason Stone led the team, finishing second overall with a time of 17:14.67 in the 5K run.

Also scoring were: 3. Zach Jewell - 17:44.37, 9. Jayden Marr - 18:27.62, 18. Gage Cornett - 19:18.76, and 19. Houston Hodges - 19:22.11.

Additional results included: 23. Blake Bryant - 19:41.56 and 40. Austin Purvis - 21:27.46

John Cason, of Owensboro Catholic, was the individual winner with a time of 16:49.01.

Stone and Jewell were medalists for the Dragons.

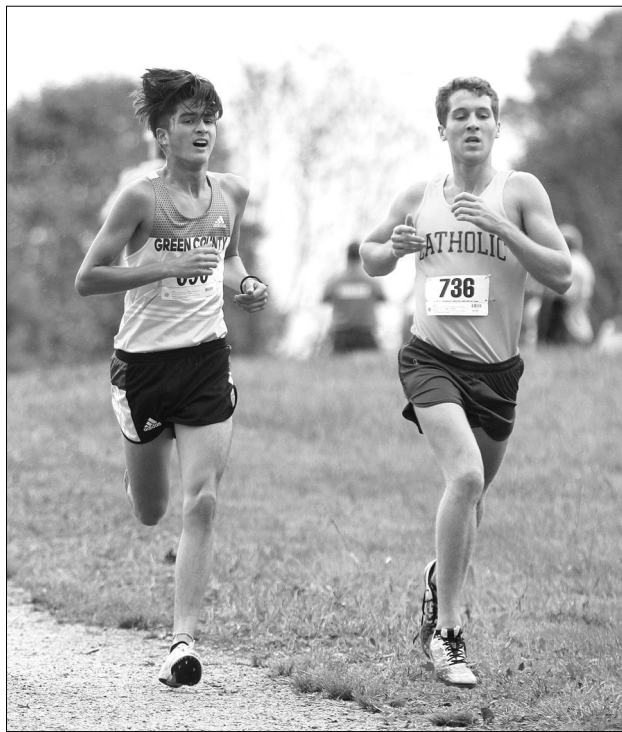
"The guys ran well enough to secure a runner-up finish in the

regional meet at BG. However, the showing was not exactly what we were looking for. We wanted to bring home a championship, but we were outperformed Saturday (Oct. 26). I feel like this team is the best in the region. We just didn't really show that in this race. We give our opponents credit. We beat a lot of good teams and I'm proud of this team and I believe we will have something to say about this result Saturday at state. This team is full of talent from top to bottom and I think we will be ready to roll this weekend," said Coach Erik Edwards.

"Mason and Zach ran great races and were where I expected them to be and our young guys ran well. We've got some things to tighten up this week. I know the talent of Gage Cornett and Blake Bryant will be key to our team's success at state and if we can close our 1 through 5 gap, we will be fine. I love my guys and I have faith Saturday they will bring all they've got."

Meredith Abell led the girls' team, placing seventh and recording a time of 22:04.26 in the 5K run. She was a medalist as well.

Hailie LaMar, of Hancock County, was

the individual winner, running in 19:46.59.

"I want to start by saying how proud I am of these young girls. From Monday of last week to Thursday, they were focused on their workouts and even surprised themselves with what they were able to endure. We had some tough workouts, but they never backed down. We knew we had a chance to qualify for state and each girl had a goal she was trying to meet to help us get there. We were prepared for the weather as they ran in a down-pour on Monday (Oct. 21), but it turned out not to be too bad. The girls have bonded these last two weeks and have supported and pushed one another. The result of that was that five girls had their season best performance and the other two were very close," said Coach Karla Deaton.

"Our lead runner

was Meredith Abell, followed by Carlee Coffey. Kendal Peer was our third runner and Kally Corbin was number four for us. Hadley Nunn made huge gains for us and rounded out our top five. I was so proud of her since she got called up to varsity after fall break, so she's had to really put in extra effort to catch up. Jewell Hines and Brianna Purvis were our 6th and 7th place finishers. Meredith, Carlee, Kally, Hadley, and Jewell all had season best times, which is encouraging. We know we have our work cut out for us this week, but we're ready. I just hope folks can appreciate what this very young group of girls has accomplished. To me, it's impressive."

Green County will compete in the KHSAA Class A State Championships this Saturday at the Kentucky Horse Park in Lexington.
