## Robert David Heiskell, Sr., 85

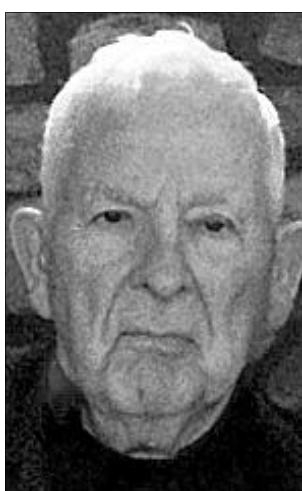
