Nov. 4, 2009

October was wet - Greensburg received 7.45 inches of rain in October making it the wettest October in Green County history.

Band going to state - The GCHS Marching Dragons Band will compete in the state semi-finals.

Ceremony to honor vets - There will be a Veteran's Day ceremony to honor veterans at the Old Community Cemetery.

C of C awards - Mimi Moore and Peggy Jones were dual recipients of the Sam Moore Award given by the Chamber of Commerce recognizing community visionaries.

Nov. 3, 1999

Patton wins in

county - Incumbent Democrat Paul Patton carried the county in the governor's race.

Black gold - The largest crop of black walnuts in Kentucky is paying off for some Green County people. Forty tons have been sold at Greensburg Milling. One person sold 12,000 pounds of nuts, earning \$1,259.17 in ten days.

Area code in full effect - The 270 area code is in full effect in 45 central and western Kentucky counties.

Rally on the Square - Several hundred people attended the 3rd annual Rally on the Square showing support for a drug-free community.

Nov. 2, 1989

Good voter turnout expected - County Court Clerk Billy

Squires expects 65 percent of registered voters to vote in Tuesday's election.

Bridge maintenance underway - Sand blasting and painting of the metal supports underneath the Green River Bridge.

Canoe livery possible - A contract was signed between Ed Council and American Legion Post 129 to operate a canoe at Legion Park.

New city policeman - Joe Blakeman has been hired by the City Police Department.

Nov. 8, 1979

Crawford speaker at meeting - Byron Crawford, Courier-Journal columnist, will be guest speaker at the Council of Commerce meeting.

Local business-

man dies - Woodson Turner, farmer, businessman, church and community leader, passed away Nov. 5.

Property damage serious - Several fires that destroyed property on Halloween night are being investigated for arson.

Nunn carries Green County - Gubernatorial candidate Louie B. Nunn carried the election in Green County by 256 votes, but lost the state election.

Nov. 6, 1969

Fire hits Milby farm - A fire on the Ted Milby farm destroyed property valued between \$7,000 and \$8,000.

Teens injured - Gary Curry and Dusty Nunn were injured in a one-vehicle accident on Hwy. 61.

Halloween damage - Hay and mailboxes were the targets of vandals on Halloween Night.

Stolen car recovered - A car stolen from Finis Dile, Campbells-ville, was recovered on the Green-Adair line.

Nov. 6, 1959

Dudgeon killed in wreck - Aubrey Ewell Dudgeon, 29, Campbells-ville, died when his car crashed on the Campbells-ville Road.

Combs gets the vote - Democrat Bert T. Combs claimed the governor's race in the state.

Little Barren - We have had a lot of frost and the air is nippy.
