# County approves local board appointments

Green County Fiscal Court, meeting in regular session Thursday evening, approved the appointments of Cathy Froggett and Larry P. Clark to the Green County Extension District Board, a term of two years beginning Jan. 1, 2020 through Dec. 31, 2022 and the reappointments of Patsy Pruitt and Jay Shofner for a three-year term to the Industrial Development Authority Board beginning Dec. 1, 2019 through Nov. 30, 2022.

In other business, Magistrates approved:

(1) The Russell Creek Bridge Funding Agreement, amounting to \$562,000, and a resolution between the Green County Fiscal Court and the Commonwealth of Kentucky, Transportation Cabinet, Department of Highways, regarding the Russell Creek Bridge Project;

"I am very pleased to announce that the Russell Creek bridge

has been fully funded by the Transportation Cabinet. I certainly want to thank Secretary Thomas, Gray Tomblyn, Senator David Givens, and Representative Brandon Reed for their efforts and assisting us in acquiring the funding," said Judge-Executive John Frank.

"This bridge has been needed for years and will certainly be a huge help to people who travel Russell Creek Road."

(2) The first reading of a budget amendment for fiscal year 2019-2020 involving general and road funds;

(3) To move forward in the process of adding Policeman Way to the county road system, a distance of some 1,300 feet;

(4) The purchase of first aid kits not to exceed \$800 for the county road department.

Judge-Executive Frank informed the Court regarding campground income to date at American Legion Park for the 2019 calendar year, an amount

totaling \$7,692.

"I am thrilled with the results that the campground is producing. The total net income since the inception of the campground is approximately \$20,250," said Judge Frank.

"These net proceeds have been and will continue to be used to improve our park."
