The \$77,000 that has been raised was put to work immediately.

A new steel roof replaced the old leaking shingles with expert care by our local Sturdi Built company. The fireplace was made secure for use by Matt Gooden Masonry.

The rotting window seals and the 17 leaking windows have been replaced. The large windows with the many panes required handcrafted work. The windows varied in size and demanded individual measurements. Fortunately that skill was possessed by Marty Glanzer. Marty not only custom made each window, he did the painting and installations.

We know that just like pretty wrapped presents, we usually are more curious about what's inside a package and so it should be





the same with the Old Courthouse.

The interior— it's beautiful, but serious repairs are needed due to the neglect of regular maintenance. The interior ceiling of the rooms in the balcony are in need of plaster repair from old water damage. In fact, this is such a concern that visitors are prohibited from going to the balcony. Cracks in the down-stairs plaster needs repairing and new paint. The old benches need repairs or new ones made in the correct period style using local woodworkers.

The original fundraising drive was \$100,000. We are currently \$23,000 short of our goal.

In an effort to continue this successful Old Courthouse Restoration, a garage sale is being held Nov. 29-30 at the Discovery Building on the corner of Old Hodgenville Road and North First Street. This building was formerly the Greensburg Auto Parts and formerly owned by Morris Goff.

A variety of choice items will be offered for purchase. Come in and see the old Christmas Shop with primitive wood decorations, Santa and Snowmen Collections, many antiques, rugs, lamps.

Plus many items for which you may barter.

30% of sales go to the Courthouse Restoration Project. The garage will be known as the Ole Christmas store with wreaths, garland and old fashion and household items. It will be opened for 2 days only; 9 a.m. to 7 p.m. Nov 29-30.

Please come in on Black Friday and shop before and after the Christmas lighting ceremony.

Windows from the Old Courthouse will be for sale at \$50 each. First to buy gets first choice of the 17 available windows.

We are so grateful for each of you who have contributed to the preservation of the Courthouse. Help us reach our goal of \$100,000 before the end of the year and finish the job we started.
