Cattle rustling reported in county

Staff Report

Reports were made to the Holmes County Sheriff's Department in September, October and December of last year of cattle and property thefts. A total of 11 bovines were reported stolen in two cases and two cattle gates in the third case. On September 21, 2018,

three black cows, one "mottley faced" cow and one calf was reported stolen from a pasture on Webster Creek Road around 9 a.m.

On October 30, 2018, three bulls, one red heifer and two black cows were reported stolen from a pasture on Richard Travis Road.

On December 21, 2018, two large cattle gates were reported stolen from a property on Mallory Road.

Holmes County Sheriff Willie March said cases of cattle rustling have also been reported in neighboring counties including Attala and Carroll.

Thanks to a grant from the BankPlus and the Federal Home Loan Bank (FHLB) of Dallas Affordable Housing Program (AHP), 60 low-in-

come, qualified, and Board-selected homeowners of Holmes County will receive some much-needed housing repairs during 2019.

The Holmes County por-

tion of the grant is a part of the total grant (\$745,200) awarded to BankPlus, an FHLB of Dallas member institution, for both Holmes and Carroll Counties. The

Community Students Learning Center (CSLC), a 501 (c) 3, non-profit organization of Lexington, will serve as sponsoring facilitator for BankPlus.

Collectively, the grant targets the rehab of 75 homes in both counties of which the

Board of Supervisors are responsible for assisting with the selection and qualifying process.

"The Holmes County Board of Supervisors is proud to be in partnership with the Community Students Learning Center and
