Senate passes bill banning abortions when fetal heartbeat detected

The state Senate passed legislation last week that prohibits abortion in cases where a fetal heartbeat is detected, Lt. Gov. Tate Reeves said.

"A beating heart means life has begun and should be protected," Lt. Gov. Tate Reeves said. "This bill is another step in our work to make Mississippi the safest place in America for an unborn child."

Senate Bill 2116, which provides an exemption for cases of medical emergencies, heads to the House for consideration. The bill is sponsored by Sens. Angela Hill, R-Picayune, and Chris Caughman, R-Mendenhall.

grees; grease a 10-inch bundt cake pan. Sift the flour, baking powder, salt and cocoa together; set aside. With an electric mixer, cream the butter, shortening, and sugar until fluffy. Add the eggs, one at a time, beating well after each. Add the flour mixture alternately with the milk, beginning and ending with flour. Add the vanilla and pour mixture into prepared pan. Bake for 1 hour and check for doneness with a toothpick. Cool in pan for 30 minutes before turning onto a wire rack to cool completely.
