In the criminal case, Walmart agreed to pay \$138 million to avoid prosecution, while its Brazilian subsidiary, WMT Brasilia, pleaded guilty to violating the Foreign Corrupt Practices Act.

As for the civil case, the SEC announced a \$144 million settlement against merous red flags indicating Practices Act ranging from Walmart for "failing to operate a sufficient anticorruption compliance program" in Brazil, China, India and Mexico.
