as conducted an evaluation as required by Executive Order 11988, in accordance with HUD regulations at 24 CFR 55.20 Subpart C Procedures for Making Determinations on Floodplain Management, to determine the potential affect that its activity in the floodplain will have on the human environment for Community Development Block Grant under Title I of the Housing and Community Development Act of 1974 (PL 93-383). The proposed project(s) is located at 71 & 85 Jessie D. Banks Drive, in Tchula, Holmes County. The subject property is located along the west side of Granderson Road in Tchula, Mississippi and consists of approximately 10.77 acres. More specifically, the property is situated in Section 8. Township 15 North, Range 1 East, Holmes County, Mississippi. The project site may also be referenced by Global Positioning System (GPS) coordinates 33.175634, -90.219599. The identified property is proposed for residential development to include the installation of additional paved roadways and residential structures as described herein, the subject property consists of ±9.56 acres, the proposed residential development will include 6 proposed duplex units (12 housing units) (3 bedroom/2 bath), and 4 proposed duplex units (8 housing units) (4 bedroom/2 bath), the area of the proposed development will be approximately 5.0 acres, the proposed development site is located within the 100 year floodplain (A Zone). The entire area of the proposed development lies within the FEMA 1% annual flood hazard area as noted on FEMA Flood Insurance Rate Map numbers 28051C0186E and 28051C0187E.

BGC Advantage acknowledges compliance with state and local floodplain protection procedures as outlined in Executive Order 11988 and 24 CFR 55.20 Subpart C Procedures for Making Determinations on Floodplain Management. The City of Tchula did not evaluate alternative sites as the subject parcel (approximately 10.77 acres) was deeded to the Mississippi Region VI RAD, LP by the City of Tchula, MS for the purpose of construction of affordable housing. Based on this information, BGC Advantage has reevaluated the alternatives to building in the floodplain and has determined that it has no practicable alternative. Environmental

This activity will have no significant impact on the environment for the following reasons: By elevating the buildings, and using pervious surfaces throughout the site, the construction will have minimal effects on water resources. Impacts to the floodplain will also be limited due to construction occurring within the previously developed site. Although portions of the Jessie D. Banks site are located in a 100-year floodplain, the project has been adapted in order to minimize effects on floodplain values. Additionally, steps were taken in order to minimize risks to human life and property via evacuation plans, construction methods, flood insurance, etc. Due to land available slope, wetland, financial costs, and other concerns as well as the requirement that the project be constructed within city limits due to bond issues, the Jessie D. Banks Drive site is the only location that satisfies these needs and concerns without displac-

ing residents.

There are three primary purposes for this notice. First, people who may be affected by activities in floodplains and those who have an interest in the protection of the natural environment should be given an opportunity to express their concerns and provide information about these areas. Second, an adequate public notice program can be an important public educational tool. The dissemination of information about floodplains can facilitate and enhance Federal efforts to reduce the risks associated with the occupancy and modification of these special areas. Third, as a matter of fairness, when the Federal government determines it will participate in actions taking place in floodplains, it must inform those who may be put at greater or continued risk.
