Robinson estimated it has been over 20 years since Durant's electrical system was last modernized.

Disruptions of electrical service for residents and businesses should be at a minimum as work starts.

"The power should not go overhanging limbs and trees out," Robinson explained, "they'll have relays that were put in a few years ago, before my administration. We've already updated parts of the system. There may be some instances where (electricity) would be shut off, but we'll let out customers know in advance. It won't be for a long period of time."

"This is just a great opporthe entire electrical system tunity to improve our infrastructure and hopefully get more industry in to improve our economic situation in the city," said Robinson.

The mayor also mentioned ongoing talks over the past months between the city and a potential restaurant to open in the city limits. "It's
