## State tax free holiday set for July 26 and 27

Shoppers and deal hunters will be on the prowl for bargains ahead of this month's sales tax holiday on Friday, July 26 and Saturday, July

The Mississippi Depart ment of Revenue (MDR) has announced this year' guidelines on tax free goods across the state and what items are eligible. Beginning new this year, school supplies are now included in the tax free weekend
All clothing, footwear and school supplies under $\$ 100$ can be purchased minus the $7 \%$ state sales tax
Sen. Chuck Younger co authored the bill that passed last year and said it's long lected or paid on purchases
verdue.
Younger says if there's tax-exempt holiday for firearms, then there should be one to help parents and teachers with school supplies.
School supplies are defined as "items that are commonly used by a student in a course of study," according to MDR. Some items listed are backpacks, binders, crayons, glue, lunch boxes, notebooks, loose-leaf ruled notebook paper, pencils, rulers, sheet music and textbooks.
Under Mississippi Code Section 27-65-111(bb) a sales tax holiday is held in the state, a temporary period when sales taxes are not col-
lected or paid on purchases
of specific products and/or services.
Passed by state legislators in 2009, the seven percent state sales tax is not due on that sale of articles of clothing or footwear if the sales price of a single item is less than $\$ 100$, regardless of how many items total are sold at that time, according to the state guidelines.
"For example, a customer purchases two shirts at $\$ 50$ each, a pair of slacks at $\$ 75$ and a pair of shoes at $\$ 110$. No sales tax is due on the sale of the two shirts and the pair of slacks at a cost of $\$ 175.00$, even though the combined cost exceeds the one hundred dollar (\$100) threshold. However, Sales Tax is due on the entire $\$ 110.00$ for the shoes since they exceed the one hundred dollar (\$100) threshold,"
