School board approves CPSD calendar for 2019-20

Students will start the 2019-20 school year on Thursday, August 8, in Clinton's public schools.

The calendar sets the faculty start date on Thursday, August 1, and the end of school on Friday, May 22.

"This calendar is similar to the current school year calendar, with school starting the second week in August," said Superintendent Dr. Tim Martin. "It was developed with input from faculty, staff and administrators."


Mississippi public schools are required to hold 180 days of instruction. The

calendar is crafted with this in mind, with breaks in August, October, and January for professional development. There will be half-days on December 20 and May 22.

One change that was implemented in the 2018-19 school year that will remain is that schools will be closed for President's Day, February 17, 2019.

School district operations are driven

by the calendar in many ways, Martin said, impacting teacher contracts, academic programs, athletics, extra



curricular activities, state testing, holidays and general scheduling.

The calendar approved by the Clinton School Board shows only the start and end dates of the school year, holidays and professional development days for teachers. Additional information — including registration dates and times — will be developed in the coming months.
