

Attache' Spring Revue set for May 1-4

Nationally acclaimed for nearly four decades, Clinton High's Attache' show choir will shine on stage before Mississippi audiences at its 2019 Spring Revue.

Talented soloists, dancers and other performers are busy rehearsing for shows booked at the Clinton High Auditorium May 1-4. Each evening, the teens will supply entertainment in their hometown. Performances begin at 7:30 p.m. This year's theme is the movies, and organizers say the shows shouldn't be missed.

Attache' was recognized as the Host Show Choir for Show Choir Nationals at the Grand Ole Opry in Nashville, Tennessee the past eighteen years. During the twenty-seven-year tenure of directors David and Mary Fehr, the group was selected Grand Champions in 80 of 89 competitions.

Attache' honors nationwide are well-deserved. Under the Fehrs' direction, Clinton High's Attache has

never lost a competition in the South. And going back thirty-nine years (the first twelve under director Winona Costello), the group stayed undefeated against every school the Arrows faced in Mississippi.

The current national winning streak of eighteen straight competitions with the Clinton teens capturing both vocals and visuals remains an all-time record.

For people who never witnessed one of their stunning performances or patrons going almost every year, there are good reasons to buy tickets.

"Everyone needs to see this year's show; it is one of the best Attache' has ever done," says Chad Phillips, co-president of the Attache' Boosters. "David and Mary Fehr, along with their team, have outdone themselves again."

Mississippi College's digital media and communications manager, Phillips and his wife, Jenny, are proud Attache' parents. Their daughter, Gracie, is a CHS senior and Attache' singer/dancer

for three years.

This season's Spring Revue should appeal to audiences of all ages. It will feature entertainment from American movies – stretching from the early days of cinema to recent blockbusters.

The Attache' record for the current school year is stellar.

"In 2019, Attache completed the never-before-achieved feat of defeating the last remaining group that beat them in 2013 at The Event in Chatham, Illinois," David Fehr said. "It thus gives Attache' bragging rights on every school in the nation."

In 2019, the show choir also swept two Southern competitions in Jasper, Alabama, and Petal, Mississippi. From 2010 to 2019, Attache' participated in thirty-one competitions and won thirty grand championships, Fehr reports.

Interested patrons are encouraged to purchase tickets soon.

"It's not uncommon for Attache' to sell out Spring Revues. This is an extremely popular annual event, so we

encourage fans to purchase tickets in advance," says Sandi Beason, public information director for Clinton public schools. "Attache' is quantifiably the best show choir in the nation."

Attache' consists of 44 singer/dancers, 16 pit members, and 14 crew members. Robert Allen serves as pit director, and Deborah Morgan is the crew director. Choreographers include April James, Stephen Todd, Dexter Bishop, Kellis McSparrin Oldenburg and Harley McAlexander.

Tickets for the Spring Revue range between \$9 and \$10. Tickets can be purchased at the Clinton High auditorium starting Thursday, April 18, from 9 a.m. until 4 p.m. Other times that tickets will be available are from Tuesday, April 23, through Friday, April 26, from 9 a.m. until 4 p.m. Tickets will be on sale the same hours from Monday, April 29, through Friday, May 3.
