
"We are so thankful to Independent Metal Craft in Clinton for how hard they worked on it," Boyd said, adding that they had great ideas for details.

Earlier this year, a contest was held to name the train. Jonathan Ford submitted the winning name, which was Turner. Turner the Train is named for Louis Turner, who in 1928, assisted by a crew of workers, laid all of the bricks on Clinton's famed brick streets. Turner, a veteran of World War I, worked with extreme pace laying all 600,000+ bricks in a just a handful of days as the November weather turned from chilly to cold. The tribute to Turner, who literally laid the foundation of Clinton's most treasured relic, pays homage to an unsung legend of the city. Turner the Train will travel the same streets built by his namesake 91 years ago.

"We are thrilled that Turner the Train will be making some appearances at Main Street Clinton events," Main Street Program Director Tara Lytal said.
