

Mississippi Department of Agriculture and Commerce and is a family-friendly event where interacting with farmers and producers is designed to be informative and fun for all. Fresh at Five organizers say they are especially pleased to welcome several cooking and food preparation demonstrations. Stephanie Mobley with Blue Cross Blue Shield will demonstrate on June 25. Other markets will feature local foodies sharing tips and how-tos on appointed Tuesdays.

Adding to the relaxed shopping atmosphere, market experiences may include live music and a little lagniappe with younger market attendees in mind. June 4 guests include the Clinton Community Nature Center and the Clinton Quisenberry Public Library. Both will offer information about summer activities available to the children of Clinton. Crown Club of Clinton and art students from Mt. Salus Christian School will often be on hand during the summer to assist children with activities and crafts.
