At Mt. Salus, our students are challenged in all areas, including but not limited to aca-

demics, discipleship, and leadership. Students can anticipate challenging academic classes continuing in the Mt. Salus tradition, which has led many students to achieve high scores on the ACT, PSAT and

SAT. STAR students each year have received scholarships to schools of their choice. Mt. Salus also offers a

STEAM program (Science, Technology, Engineering, Art, Math) for

elementary grades in grades one through five. The STEAM program meets once a week to further enhance the development of a student's potential and education through a hands-on approach.

We strive to prepare students for college and the future work force by incorporating technology into our curriculum. Kindergarten through eighth grade students have access to Apple iPads for use in technology class and specials, and students use educational applications to help learn and reinforce a variety of concepts from math to spelling.
